During our mission, we will fly to and dock with the space station, perform a space walk, open up a brand new module, install and check out crucial systems on board the station, unload a cargo resupply vessel, operate the shuttle robotic arm, and finally undock and fly around the station. One of the most fulfilling aspects of our flight is the international nature of the International Space Station project. Our joint U.S./Russian crew will train here in Houston, as well as in Star City, Russia, and Baikonur, Kazakhstan. This truly is an astronaut's dream mission.
